future might look like for Māori in a post-Treaty
settlement New Zealand. The hui will bring together
a range of voices to explore and shape the future
of Aotearoa.

The outputs from the workshop will include a booklet
and a final presentation at Government House to be
held on Wednesday, 22 November 2017. The workshop
will encourage the formation of a youth network for
participants to share skills and insights among their
peers. We hope this will gain momentum as participants
return to their respective tūrangawaewae.

If you are between 18 and 25 years of age, identify
with a specific iwi, hapū or as urban Māori, and are
interested in attending this workshop, please fill in an
